How to turn off the run prompt from Internet Explorer 7.0

(Applies to both XP and Vista)

After installing Microsoft Internet Explorer Verion 7 you may get a message box that reads:

Open File - Security Warning

The publisher could not be verified. Are you sure you want to run this software?

Name: ccs.exe

Publisher: Unknown Publisher

Type: Application

From: Z:\Vetccs (or some other location)

Run or Cancel buttons

This file does not have a valid digital signature that verifies its publisher. You should only run software from publishers you trust.

You will get that message for any software you attempt to run from a networked drive. This means the prompt will show up on every workstation, but not the server computer.

To shut this off, do the following on each computer:

Go to control panel Select <Internet Options>

On the screen that opens select the <Security tab>

Click on <Local Intranet>

Then click on <Sites>

Then click on <Advanced>

In the box labeled "Add this website to the zone" type the name of the server computer. If this does not work, you may have to type in the server name as \\servername or enter a shared drive letter e.g. F:\.

After you have done this, click on the <Add> button

Then click <Close> then <OK> Twice

After this you should be able to run applications from the server without being harrassed. Unfortunately you will have to do this on every computer running IE 7.
